Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act
of Congress of the 7th of June 1832

State of Georgia \supset G.

On this twentyfourth day of July, in the
year Eighteen Hundred and thirty two personally appeared
before the Inferior Court of the County and state aforesaid
said Jesse Holbrook a resident of Capt. Greenmans
district in the County and state aforesaid, aged
sixty seven (67) years, who being first duly sworn ac-
-cording to Law, doth, on his oath make the following
declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the act of Congress passed June 7. 1832
that he enlisted in the army of the United States, about
12 or 13⁽¹⁸⁾ month, before Cornwallis' defeat at Fort town ^{Oct 7, 1781} does not
recollect the year) enlisted, with Capt Robert Woodson, a
recruiting officer, and served in the 2nd Virginia Regiment
of the ^{Continent} Continental Regular Army under the following names
officer, tent. He enlisted at the Court House of Soochland County
in Virginia with Capt. Woodson & was marched from there to
Manchester Barracks in Frederick County Virginia, and was
placed under the command of Capt Kirkpatrick, and
was under the command of Col. Horsey or Horsey, he
enlisted for three years or during the war, and left the
service on his regular discharge by Col Horsey the Fall
of the year after Cornwallis' defeat.
He resided at the time of ^{of his enlistment} ~~his enlistment~~ in the County where he
enlisted as aforesaid, he was in no particular battle, ~~at~~
~~the time of Cornwallis' defeat~~ he was stationed at Manchester
guarding some Hopian prisoners, was marched from
Manchester in pursuit of Cornwallis, to a place called
the Point of Fort on James river where he was finally
discharged. During his service he was once under the
command of General Muhlberg. He has before made
application, he thinks, under the act of 15th ^{& his papers are in the War department} May 1828, But
was rejected for what reason he does not know, He was
a private during the whole service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension
or to an annuity, except the present, and he declares, that

his name is not on the Pension roll of any Agency in any state that to the best of his recollection he served eighteen months before he was discharged.

He has lost his discharge; but incloses a certificate from the Land office of Virginia to show that he was entitled to a bounty of land for 3 years service in the Continental Line.

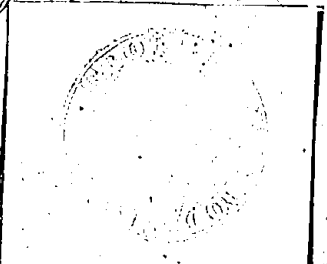

Dear Madam:

The data which follow in regard to Jesse Holbrook were obtained from pension claim, S. 31754, based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

Jesse Holbrook was born in 1764 in Goochland County, Virginia. The names of his parents are not shown.

While a resident of Goochland County, Virginia, Jesse Holbrook enlisted about twelve or eighteen months before the surrender of Cornwallis, served at Winchester Barracks, in Frederick County, Virginia, as a private in Captain Kirkpatrick's Virginia company, and was discharged in the fall of 1781 after having served about eighteen months.

The soldier was allowed pension on his application executed July 24, 1832, at which time he was living in ~~Cornwallis~~ Freeman District, Franklin County, Georgia. He died in that county May 25, 1844.

Jesse Holbrook's wife did not survive him but he left the following named children: Pleasant Holbrook, Elizabeth Holbrook, Sarah Arundell and Mahala Gober, all of whom in 1832 were residing in Franklin County, Georgia.
