YOU are forthwith to admeasure and lay out, unto William Crowler a Tract of Land, containing Five Hundred Acres, lying in Tyrrel or Bertie County; within the said District;

Being the Vacant Land, on Courtenay Island in Roan-Dak River. Joining the Lines of Nicholas Crisp, John Speers, John Duggan and Samuel Smithwick.

Observing my Instructions, for running out of Lands; Three just and fair Plans whereof, certified under your Hand, you are to return to me, within Six Months from the Date hereof: Which Survey of the abovementioned Lands, so to be returned as afore-said, shall be good and valid for the said William Crowler

provided he the said William Crowler do, within Twelve Months after such Return, take out a Grant of the same Land, to compleat his Title; otherwise this Warrant, and such your Return thereof, shall be void, and of no Force, and the said Lands be deemed vacant, and free to be taken up by any other Person, that shall apply for that Purpose. 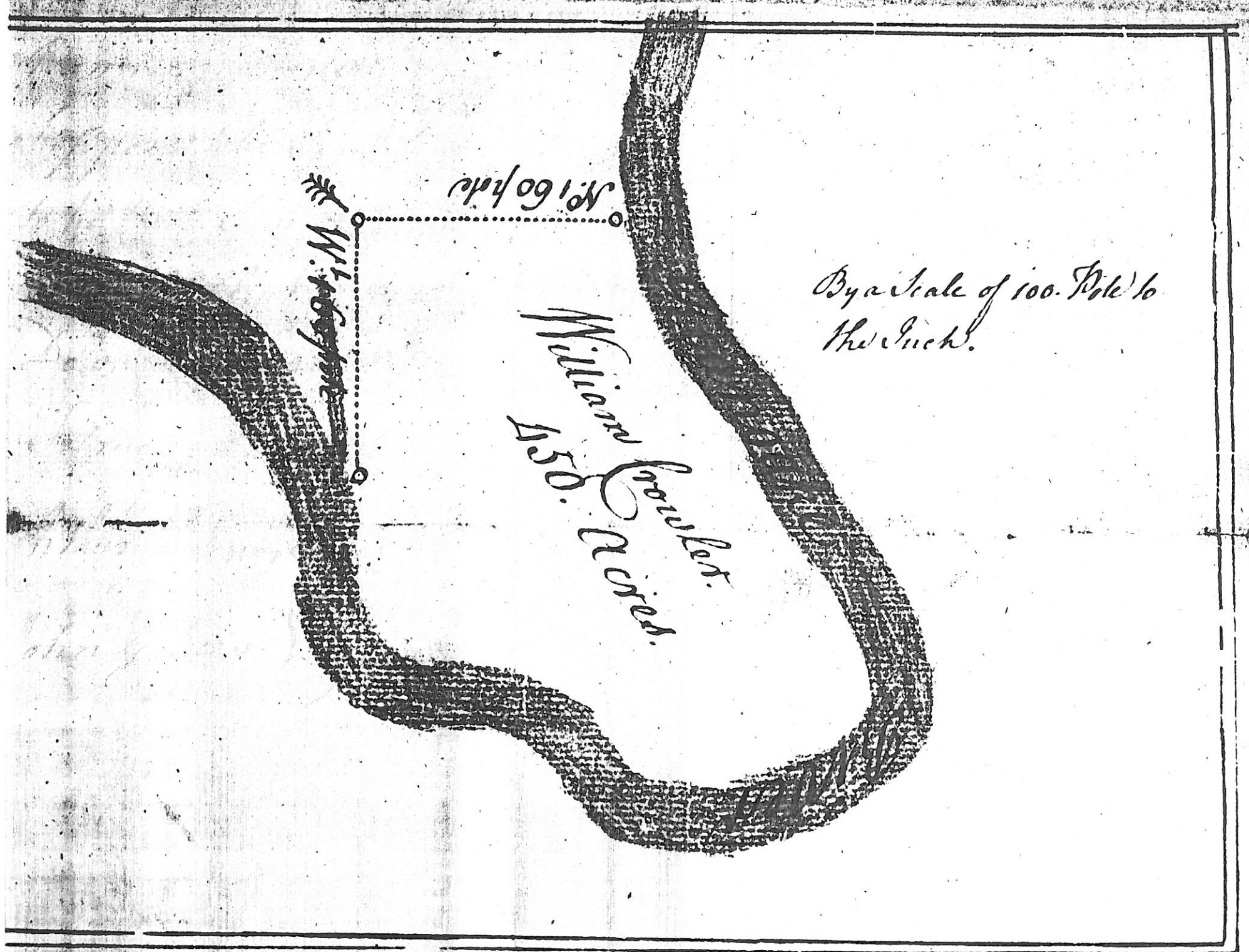

The above Plan Represents 450. Acres of Land Survey'd for William Corcoran in the County of Bertie lying in Foreline Island Beginning at a Cypress on the River Bank Opposite the Cow Landing & Running thence N. 160. Pole to a Cypress near a Small Gut Supposed to be Sam. Smith's line. Thence N. 160. Pole Supposed to be the S. Smith's line to a Gum on the River bank near the Mouth of a Gut Supposed to be the S. Smith's corner. Thence Down the various Courses of the River to the first Station.
