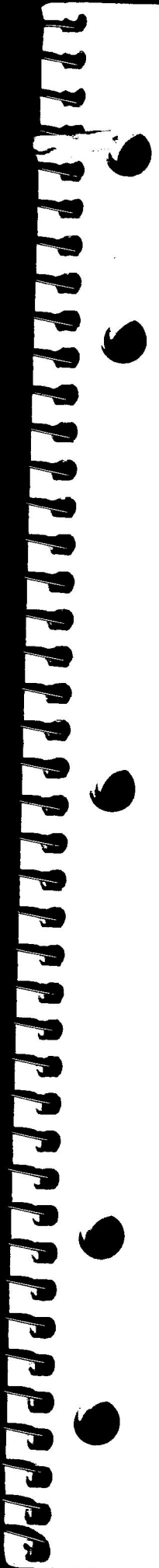

David Decolt Nowlin and Lula Nowlin
moved from the Northern part of Winston
County to what was known then as
Elk Alabama. Later it was changed to Falls
City, Alabama, and the Post office was
moved to a place near Clear Creek, Ala.
It had two water falls. The Post office
was named after the falls.

David and Lula Nowlin entered a tract
of land (100 acre) near Falls City. The land was
bound on the West side by a hundred ft
bluff reaching all the way across the West
side. Coan Creek was under under the
bluff. Good grazing land was along
the creek bank and bottom land where
cattle grazed. They had free range at
that time. Farmers cattle could run free +
go any where they could find grass or
something to eat.

Later stock law was voted into then
the people had to make pasture and
fence it in and keep the cattle up

a big branch run down the hollow
a hill was on either side
Lula did her washing clothes at the branch
and a good spring was close where they

got their drinking ^{water}. Later they had a well drilled in the front yard. in the mean time three children were born to them.

There were two churches in the community, a Missiway Baptist ^{church} where we all belong, and a Methodist church about a mile from the Baptist.

There were two General stores about 2 mi from our house. Mr Jim Row Bennett owned one, Mr Gassie own the other across the street from each other and the Post Office.

The school was taught in the Methodist church for several years. A new school zone was taken ^{to build the school} so the parents built a new school house and named it Bill Stone that made it about a two mile walk for their children. The school room was heated by wood stove. The parents would go in the forest and cut and haul wood to the school house to be burned in the stove.

Later a large company brought a saw mill to the city and men cut down trees and built a dam on the creek and floated logs down the river. Several families moved in to get jobs and several company houses

were built a Hotel was built Mr Fred Wilson and wife run the Hotel there was a boom in Fall city for a while. Now it is all gone. Now the Gov. own all the land for forest.

A Mrs Lyon lived on top of the mountain also run a store and bought egg from the farmers there also was a bridge across the river to get from the city to other places.

In 1915 a dam was built on Tombishe river which backed up Clear Creek that that covered up the 2 falls and made Clear Creek look ^{like} a river.
